



Christians around the world associate the season of Lent as a 40-day period of prayer and fasting that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Maundy Thursday. This period of preparation commemorates the 40 days Jesus spent praying and fasting in the desert. It is a time of drawing closer to Christ as we remember all that He accomplished for us at Calvary and prepare our hearts and souls for the celebration of the resurrection on Easter Sunday.

In this year's Prayer Calendar, we'll look at major themes from the Epistle of James, and then shift our focus slightly as we move closer to Easter Sunday.

James 1:22-25: Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. But the man who looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it—he will be blessed in what he does.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 22

James 1:22 “Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.”

Heavenly Father, instill within me a deep desire during this season of Lent to prayerfully and intentionally draw closer to You. Grant to me the ability to make time for You each day and create within me a profound dependency on You as I seek to be obedient to Your Word in every area of my life. If one of you says to him, “Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed,” but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead... Was not our ancestor Abraham considered righteous for what he did?... You see that his faith and his actions were working together... Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness,” and he was called God’s friend.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 1

Father as I begin a new week of Lenten prayers, enable me to continue to grow in my relationship with You as I pray for others. In the week ahead, allow me to actively express my faith and live it out by praying for my church family, especially those I know and love and the ministries we are involved in. For each person in Children’s Ministry, hold them close and equip them to love and care for each child. Heavenly Father, for the youth in the congregation who are full of life and energy, grant to each one Your tender touch, impart to them an active faith accompanied by the knowledge of Your love, and give to each one the wisdom they need in forming friendships and making decisions about their futures. Lead them as they prayerfully wrestle with course work, reassure them of the depth of Your concern for them, and grant to each one a sense of Your guiding hand upon their future. Above all, deepen and mature their faith as You enable them to draw closer to You and rest in You amidst the complex decisions that lie before them. In Your Holy Name I pray. Amen.

Father, give to us a sense of Your enabling grace as we celebrate our 175th Anniversary this weekend. May we be like Abraham, who willingly stepped out in faith, so that our faith and actions go together as we serve the Greenville community and make an active difference in the lives of those in need. James 3:3-6: When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person...

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8

Heavenly Father, as I continue my prayers during this season of Lent, enable me to take seriously what You teach in scripture. As James reminds his readers of the powerful effect of our words, help me to remember to guard what I say and how I say it. Please forgive me when I become easily frustrated with others. Protect me from mentally criticizing those closest to me. Grant to me through the indwelling power of Your Spirit a change of heart, a change of behavior—behavior that perceives others critically, or moves me to think before I speak. Help me to control my tongue and to fast from disapproval and judgment. Amen.

THURSDAY, MARCH 9

Gracious God, as I recognize the truth that James is teaching, **“The tongue also is a fire,”** work in my soul in order that I would not only practice general restraint in what I say, but that I would especially restrain myself with my children and those I work with. Strengthen my resolve to not be so negative, metaphorically setting circumstances and relationships on fire by what I say. Enable me to be extremely careful when talking about others, especially when they are not present to hear my comments. Keep me from painfully wounding those around me. Help me to actively avoid the sins of the tongue, including dishonesty, unkindness, flattery, impurity, blasphemy, pride, criticism, exaggeration, temper, greed, slander, boasting, and many others. In Jesus name I pray. Amen.

FRIDAY, MARCH 10

Father, in this season of Lent, the temptation of Christ in the desert for 40 days is a powerful reminder of Your faithfulness in challenging circumstances. I know that Luke 4:1-13 teaches the need to resist temptation, yet I freely confess there are moments when I enjoy the sin I commit, especially sins of the tongue. When I gossip, I have information no one else has; others are listening to me; I am the center of attention; I feel "large and in charge." Please forgive me for this. Grant to me a profound sorrow for those I hurt when I misuse my tongue. Forgive me when I intentionally hurt others, bringing them down in the eyes of others. I pray that You would fundamentally change my behavior, and help me to guard against the influence of sin that corrupts the whole person. Amen.

Lead them as they prayerfully wrestle with coursework, reassure them of the depth of Your concern for them, and grant to each one a sense of Your guiding hand upon their future. Above all, deepen and mature their faith as You enable them to draw closer to You and rest in You amidst the complex decisions that lie before them. In Your Holy Name I pray. Amen.

Father, allow me to take seriously my prayers of the last few days. Help me to slow down and build new patterns and rhythms of engaging with You. Grant within me a desire for a deeper intimacy with You, and encourage me to recognize that when I am determined to grow in my faith, I am often distracted, forgetful, and preoccupied.
