Front Porch Housing is a Christ-centered, supportive, transitional program within the context of a church community whose mission is to provide safe, stable, and nurturing housing for families and individuals. Residents are equipped with the tools to achieve stability and independence through programs and classes focused on medical care, counseling, mental health, financial literacy, educational opportunities, career support, building healthy relationships, parenting, spiritual formation, life skills, and other fun and community-building activities.

Homes of Hope exists to provide affordable housing, economic mobility, and workforce development programs that help individuals and families build stable, thriving futures. Since 1998, Homes of Hope has partnered with churches, businesses, volunteers, and community members throughout SC to create pathways to lasting stability and generational change. To date, Homes of Hope has built 746 affordable homes and celebrated the graduation of 348 men from its Men's Workforce Development Program for men overcoming addiction.

Ways to get involved:

Piedmont Women's Center

Piedmont Women's Center is a faith-based non-profit ministry in Upstate SC with the mission of educating, equipping, and empowering residents to choose life and to change lives. PWC provides year-round pregnancy and sexual health care at no cost to those who come to them for service, bringing essential care to a community in need who might not otherwise have access to the services they provide. These free services include medical-grade pregnancy testing, pregnancy consultations, limited obstetrical (OB) ultrasounds, STI assessment, education, referrals, well-woman exams, child loss support, parenting classes, and material resources at three locations in the Upstate.

Ways to get involved:

Core Programs:

- ◆ Gathering new baby items for clients from our Bundles of Joy list
- ◆ Holding a Baby Bottle Campaign

Individuals:

- ◆ Resource Coach (one-on-one with clients)
- ◆ Call Center, Medical (nurses and sonographers)
- ◆ Child Loss Support (Bible study, grief support program)
- ◆ Community Ambassador (represent PWC in the community)
- ◆ Welcome Team (greeting clients as they arrive at our clinics)
- ◆ Prayer Team (once a month), Facilities & Maintenance Care, Administrative, Events (as needed)
